Theme Verse:

WEEKLY INTRO STATEMENT

"After the waters receded, YaHU'aH gave the earth a new beginning. But this was more than a restart — it was a covenant. This week, we explore how YaHU'aH reestablished life, gave instructions to Noach, and set His rainbow as a witness for all generations. In every season, He remains faithful."

VIDEO

A still, reverent earth — the ark resting on dry ground. Noach steps out with his family. Animals emerge, stretching into the clean air. He kneels to honor YaHU'aH, building an altar from stone. The smoke rises peacefully. Overhead, a radiant rainbow spans across the sky. YaHU'aH's covenant is established — His promise never to destroy the earth by flood again. The tone is sacred, warm, and filled with renewal.

17 DAILY FAMILY GUIDE

◆ DAY 1 – The Ark Comes to Rest

Reading: Genesis 8:13–19

Focus: The earth is ready for new life.

Activity: Use blocks or paper to recreate Mount Ararat.

Talk Prompt: How would your family feel stepping into a new world?

◆ DAY 2 – First Steps of Obedience

Reading: Genesis 8:20–21

Focus: Noach builds an altar first.

Activity: Build a simple family altar for quiet moments or reflection.

Discussion: What is the first thing we turn to each day?

◆ DAY 3 – A Lasting Covenant

Reading: Genesis 9:1–7

Focus: Life is sacred and must be respected.

Activity: Create a “life matters” poster with family drawings or truths.

Talk Prompt: How can we protect life in our words and actions?

◆ DAY 4 – The Rainbow Promise

Reading: Genesis 9:8–17

Focus: YaHU’aH never forgets His covenant.

Activity: Use string, colored paper, or paint to create a family rainbow banner.

Discussion: What do the colors remind you of?

◆ DAY 5 – Generations Begin Again

Reading: Genesis 9:18–23

Focus: Even in new beginnings, people must still choose righteousness.

Activity: Plant seeds in a small pot — water daily.

Talk Prompt: How do we grow righteousness?



◆ DAY 6 – Honor and Shame

Reading: Genesis 9:24–29

Focus: Choices affect generations.

Activity: Make two paper paths — one for honor, one for shame — draw what they might look like.

Discussion: What path are we choosing as a family?

◆ DAY 7 – Shabbat Reflection

Reading: Genesis 9:12–17 (Revisit the rainbow)

Focus: YaHU'aH's promises remain even when we fail.

Activity: Lie under a blue sky (or by a window) and name one promise you want to live by.

Reflection: Why does YaHU'aH use beauty to remind us of His truth?
